Library Services, in Springfield, is currently arranging for a team to come and install a complete library for the training of ministers. The Bible School ~ “*Instituto Bíblico Sinaí*” ~ is doing very well. We’re approaching the end of our first semester and enrollment is staying steady at 35 students. We have two faculty and a Bible School Committee of 5, which will eventually produce a school handbook and has already begun to set tuition, oversee academic issues, etc. Next semester we will open up to students from outside our church community so there is real potential for growth. **Beth** has been doing the childcare during classes and sees this as an additional opportunity to minister to the children, many of whom come from some very difficult situations. She’s already running the Children’s Church for the *Asamblea de Dios*, and continues to build the ministry with supplies and materials – recently she hired a carpenter to build additional furnishings which she designed. Beth is also teaching Spanish during the week to Christina’s class of 6th graders at St. Michael’s. **Christina** is doing very well after being here a full year now, and has friends both in the English & Spanish speaking communities.



Training for Street Pastors

Street Pastors is a ministry out of the United Kingdom that seeks to mobilize the saints and get them out onto the streets to minister to people. But before they can be turned loose (in teams of 4) they must pass an initial core training and then there are other training sessions along the way. Pictured above, Antiguan police officers are demonstrating techniques for getting firearms off the streets and also giving advice on dealing with controlled substances. Other sessions have involved bringing in experts to give training in human trafficking, domestic abuse issues, addictions, AIDS & HIV, counseling techniques, and of course safety issues. Tim has been recruiting bilingual believers from the Spanish Church, as there is a great need for those who can speak Spanish out on the streets – but the training sessions are in English, the dominant language here. Tim has also passed his core training as well, and including him there are now three from the Spanish Church who have already begun street ministry. Antigua has a broad range of urban problems and though only a small part of what we do here, Street Pastors has provided an outlet for ministry that is much-needed and also something that is in our hearts to do.

Recently Tim was able to join our daughter Havilah & her family in Curacao. They were visiting Billy’s mom, sister, and brother who had not yet met grandson Joshua (now 2).
